Engineering Manager Baer provided a Project Status Update re Clarifier Railings (Primary Tanks 5-10), Capital Project No. 1706, Contractor: Sjostrom & Sons, Inc. (Sjostrom). No Board action required at this time.

Engineering Manager Baer provided an update regarding project funding for the Cherry Valley Force Main Replacement and the Annual Lining and Point Repair Projects. IEPA contacted the District advising that, while it does not have the level of funding needed for the Cherry Valley Parallel Force Main, it will provide funding for Annual Lining and Collection System Repairs. Bids will not be open in time for the District's May Board Meeting. Therefore, a Special Board Meeting will be scheduled for the first week of June. No Board action is required at this time.

Operations Manager McFall reported that extraordinary flow in March (averaging 59M gallons/day), most of which was directly attributable to flooding, resulted in one quality excursion. Weekly average limit for total suspended solids is 45; one week, the Plant limit reached 46. This excursion has been reported to the State of Illinois.

Supporting Services Manager Reader provided status of activity regarding sewer main line cleaning, televising crews, pipe replacement, manhole ticket backlog breakdown and manhole restoration for the month of March.

Business Manager Black reported total revenue 4% under budget for the month and 3% over budget YTD. O&M expenses were 1% under budget YTD, and income statement reflects approximately \$4.9M net operating income through March 31, 2019. Cash increased approximately \$7.5M YTD. General fund cash total at the end of the month was approximately \$30M. Total number authorized full-time positions is 116; 115 are filled. One vacant position is for a Land Survey/Right of Way Coordinator.

Black reported that the Budget Ordinance has been published and will come back to the Board for final approval next month.

Black also reported that the IMRF has changed the assumed rate of return from 7.5 percent to 7.25 percent moving forward. Black will advise more information regarding the financial impact to the District once it becomes available.
