McFall, Scott-Valdez and Cassaro updated the Board regarding a mechanical issue at a well at the Randy Road Lift Station, Loves Park Well No. 5. A build-up of sludge was observed in the well. Analysis of the sludge revealed a high-level of radium. Loves Park had taken the well off-line in late October. The District effectively shut down the station to stop additional discharge and engaged an Ohio company that specializes in handling radium sludge to assess the situation. Evaluation of a nearby well confirmed that the sludge build-up was contained at the Randy Road Lift Station. The District met, and will continue to meet, with the City of Loves Park regarding the situation. The company will begin the initial radiological testing this week and has provided a proposal to remove the sludge at a cost of \$18,651. (Operations Staff will be requesting a sole-source purchase order toward the end of January.) When the District discovered that employees may have been affected, the District's HR Director and Risk Manager conducted research with physicians and an area expert, interviewed all employees who may have had exposure to the sludge - all of whom had minimal exposure - and conducted informational meetings and safety training for employees. The District continues to work with Loves Park, and the Randy Road Lift Station will remain closed to employees until remediation is complete. The Mayor of Loves Park has been informed of the situation, and the City of Loves Park will be covering half the cost.

Cassaro presented the Plant Operations Monthly Snapshot and Trend Report for the previous month.

Reader provided a status of Collection Systems activity regarding sewer main line cleaning, televising crews, pipe replacement, manhole ticket backlog breakdown and manhole restoration for the month of November, 2019.

Black reported that, as of the end of November, 2019, total revenue is 1.9% below budget YTD, O&M expenses are 1.1% below budget YTD; operating income reflects \$4.9M, and the Statement of Cash Flows shows an increase of \$8.2M. The General Fund ended the month at \$39M.
