AD1-4 Questions & Answers

Question 1: Can an appointment be made to look at properties in the proposal?

Answer 1: Yes, contact Dave Daughenbaugh: 815-387-7583

Question 2: How should the prairie areas be addressed?

Answer 2: Care for prairie areas is handled in-house. There may be times when the contractor would be asked for help with them, which would be work outside the contract.

Question 3: Who is the direct contact, and what is the best contact method?

Question 4: Are properties fenced?

Answer 4: Most lift stations are fenced, and contractor will be given a key to the gates. If weekend work is needed at 3333 Kishwaukee St., contact Dave, Terry or Jim to let them know; they will contact the guard house so they know to expect you.

Question 5: Where are the properties located?

Answer 5: Properties are located throughout Winnebago County.

Question 6: Are gates wide enough for equipment?

Answer 6: Yes.

Question 7: Who owns Four Rivers Sanitation Authority, it used to be called Rock River Water Reclamation District?

Answer 7: Four Rivers Sanitation Authority is still the same entity; the name changed from Rock River Water Reclamation District to Four Rivers Sanitation Authority in June of 2021.

Question 8: Are the locks keyed identically?

Answer 8: Yes, all lift station padlocks use the same key.

Question 9: What does a performance bond entail?

Answer 9: To obtain a performance bond, contractor must contact an insurance agent. A performance bond guarantees a contractor will complete the project according to the terms and requirements stated in the contract.

Question 10: Can weeds in gravel areas by sprayed?

Answer 10: They can be sprayed or removed by another method as determined by the contractor.

Question 11: Can the fence line be sprayed?

Answer 11: The fence line may be sprayed at a maximum width of 4" total.

Question 12: Is a spraying license required?

Answer 12: Yes, a license to apply restricted pesticides is required; please see AD1-5 Additional Requirement.

Question 13: At what point is work considered non-contract?

Answer 13: If the duty is listed in the contract/RFP, it is a contract item. If it is not in the contract, it may be a separate or larger project and should be discussed with Authority staff.

Question 14: Please clarify the area where clippings are to be bagged?

Answer 14: All of the mowing area of 3501 Kishwaukee Street; 2.29 acres.

Question 15: What properties are irrigated?

Answer 15: 3501 Kishwaukee Street, and a portion of 3333 Kishwaukee Street.

Question 16: Is this the first year clippings are required to be bagged?

Answer 16: Yes, clippings have been blown off surfaces in the past.

Question 17: Is the sprinkler system timed?

Answer 17: Yes, and it can be adjusted. Currently it turns off at 6 A.M.

Question 18: Are notary signatures required on all pages that say notary signature?

Answer 18: Yes, any line requiring a notary should contain the notary signature and seal.

- **Question 19:** Do three copies of the full RFP need to be printed and turned in all 83 pages? **Answer 19:** One original copy and a flash-drive containing the proposal response all 83 pages is acceptable.
- **Question 20:** Do all three copies need to have original signatures and stamp of notary signature pages or will one original and 2 copies suffice?
- **Answer 20:** One proposal must be the original with original signatures and stamp of notary signature, and two can be copies, or one original copy and a copy on a flash drive can be sent.
- Question 21: Are pages 37-45 to be filled out with the proposal or can those be left blank?
 Answer 21: Pages 37-45 are the contract sample and the performance bond form. Those should be left blank when sent with the proposal. The awarded contractor will receive a contract to sign with the watermark removed. The performance bond form will be completed and submitted by the awarded vendor.
- **Question 22:** How many applications of fertilizer and weed control would you like at each location?
- **Answer 22:** A total of three applications: one spring fertilizer, pre & post-emergent weed control & weed spraying application; one summer fertilizer, pre & post-emergent weed control & weed spraying application; one fall fertilizer & post-emergent weed control & weed spraying application at the locations listed in Section III, Detailed Specs, 3.4, D. 5 (p. 16 of the RFP). There is NO fall pre-emergent weed control application.

Question 23: Can additional printed copies of the RFP document be picked up? **Answer 23:** Yes, please ask for a copy at the Customer Service window.

Question 24: What is the budget for Lawn Maintenance?

Answer 24: No budget amount is available.

Question 25: What are the results of the last public bid opening?

Answer 25: Results from the last public bid opening from 2016 are attached.

AD1-5 Additional Requirement: By submitting their proposal, contractors acknowledge they are licensed by the State of Illinois to apply restricted use pesticides. This includes any employees who will be performing application.
